Hiker & Camping Transfers

Itinerary:

- · 8.20am Courtesy bus service between Cardwell and Port Hinchinbrook available; please pre-book.
- · 8.30am Check in at Port Hinchinbrook Marina office - 1km south Cardwell.
- 9.00am Departure aboard "Hinchinbrook Explorer II" cruising to Cape Richards (Wilderness Lodge location) and learn about the unique marine, terrestrial & cultural history of the island. Meet "Sly" a large Queensland groper and disembark Lodge guests.
- Depart Cape Richards to cruise Missionary Bay, spotting for dugong and turtle along the way, winding through the mangrove fringed creeks to the Ramsay Bay boardwalk. Final 500m is aboard our punt.
- A short walk takes you to the magnificent 9km Ramsay Beach where you have time to enjoy its splendour. Swim, play, relax or fossick for shells and fossils - no take regulations apply.
- · Depart Ramsay Bay and cruise to Macushla. Guests wishing to enjoy the 5.3km woodland, beach and rainforest walk to the Lodge disembark here. Picnic lunches are required for those choosing this option - this must be booked prior to departure. The walk is described as moderate and takes about two hours.
- 1.00pm "Hinchinbrook Explorer II" returns to Hinchinbrook Island Wilderness Lodge where guests are welcome to dine in the open air restaurant or enjoy their picnic lunch on Orchid Beach. Passengers spend their afternoon at the Lodge, some hiking from Macushla, others lazing by the pool, snorkelling from Orchid Beach (BYO gear) or swimming in the clear tropical waters.
- 3.50pm Reboard "Hinchinbrook Explorer II" for a 4.00pm departure, arriving at Port Hinchinbrook at 5.00pm.

What to bring:

Insect repellant, sunscreen, hat, bathers, beach towel, camera and

comfortable walking shoes (may get wet).

Reduced Services:

"Hinchinbrook Explorer II" operates: 1 May to 31 October -

Daily. November to January and April - Sunday, Wednesday and Friday only. No service is available February to Easter. Services subject to change - please check bookings.

The Thorsborne Trail is recognised as one of the world's classic wilderness hikes. This 3 to 7 day trail is only available for a maximum

of 40 hikers at a time. You hike through towering tropical forests, along pristine sand beaches and over mountain ridges; with time to swim in the surf and cool mountain streams.

"Hinchinbrook Explorer II" transfers hikers between Port Hinchinbrook (Cardwell) and Ramsay Bay at the northern end of the Trail. The ferry departs Port Hinchinbrook Marina at 9.00am and disembarks hikers at 11.15am. Hikers returning to Cardwell from Ramsay Bay must meet the ferry at 11.15am at the Jetty end of the boardwalk.

Camping

"Hinchinbrook Explorer II" also transfers campers to Macushla, Goold Island and

Garden Island. Check facilities prior to departure. They may include picnic tables, benches, barbecues, water tanks, shelter and amenities.
